



Folk and Rock flyers

Greenwich Village in the early 1960s was a blooming creative scene where singer-songwriters revitalized folk music with powerful messages of social activism. Venues like Gerde’s Folk City and The Night Owl nurtured intimate acoustic performances that shaped the era’s sound and spirit. At the same time, psychedelic rock blossomed in clubs such as the Fillmore East and Cafe Au Go Go, where experimental music and colorful visuals embodied the counterculture’s quest for new consciousness and community.
